News Around Us

The Coronavirus started in
Wuhan, China. Currently 425
people have died in China
because of the
coronaviruses. It has also
affected 23 other
countries, one of them is
the United States. The US
confirmed 11 cases of the
virus on February 2. There
are six in California, two in
Illinois, one in Arizona, one
in Massachusetts, and one in
Washington.

After some research,
scientists think that the
coronavirus was caused by a
bat. Based on these results,
the authors said the
2019-nCoV likely originated
in bats. However, no bats
were sold at the Huanan
seafood market, which
suggests that another
yet-to-be-identified animal
acted as a stepping stone of
sorts to transmit the virus
to humans.

"It seems likely that
another animal host is acting
as an intermediate host
between bats and humans,"
said study co-lead author
Guizhen Wu, of the Chinese
Center for Disease Control
and Prevention. (Centers


